- Spring jazz series- Latin, Afro, Cuban, Contemporary & Big Band- coordinating classes & workshops for high school students
- Collaboration with Arts 10566- 8-week theater tech classes in preparation for a multischool performance on June 9th
- Summer Camp in collaboration with Antonia Arts- 8-9 year olds thru high schoolperforming arts & technical aspects
