There is much to be thankful for at Peekskill High School. I am thankful for the opportunity to serve as your child's principal. I am equally thankful for being a part of a committed community and having a dedicated staff that put the needs of children first. The staff and administration of PHS are thankful for your trust and partnership. Through active collaboration, we will create a home school partnership that will allow **ALL** students to flourish and *Dare to be GREAT*. We have amazing students striving to achieve their dreams and greatness. Your nurturing and tender touch lay the foundation to make this possible.

In an effort to support our students and families, the staff members of PHS donated \$1,050 to support families in need during this holiday season. The students in our Great Potential Program received over 50 items of nonperishable food from their food drive. This food was delivered to families on *Thursday, December 22<sup>nd</sup>*. In addition, two staff members combined their effort and resources to provide families with food, clothing and financial support totaling \$450.

On *Wednesday, December 21*<sup>st</sup>, Mr. Arthur, Principal and his wife, Dr. Arthur, sponsored a laptop and Kindle giveaway to students at PHS. With the collective efforts of the school counselors, social worker, school psychologists, teachers of the English Department and the school library media specialist, five students out of two hundred were selected to receive a laptop. In early December, the staff members of PHS were asked to identify a student who has demonstrated great improvement in attending school, shown academic progress and does not have a computer at home. After a three weeks period, the committee selected five students. For the Kindle giveaway, students were chosen after writing an essay explaining why they deserve to win a free Kindle. The five best essays were selected by the staff of PHS.

To celebrate their achievement and to honor their overall progress at PHS, a special luncheon was held for these students and their parents. The students who were selected for a laptop were not informed that they were nominated for an award. Moreover, they

were not aware that they were going to be awarded a free Chromebook. They were presented with the laptop by the staff member who nominated them for the award. This was a special event that brought tears to the eyes of many who attended. Dr. David Fine, Superintendent of Schools, offered warm remarks to our students and their families.

Mid-way through, Mr. Arthur explained the purpose of the celebration. He informed students and their families that when he [Mr. Arthur] was a high school student, teachers filled the void in his life by providing him with unconditional support. He added that teachers took the time to get to know him and build a strong relationship with him, which encouraged Mr. Arthur to take risks and still feel confident, even when his responses were incorrect.

According to Mr. Arthur, when he graduated from high school, teachers gave him a financial award to assist him during his first year at college. Moreover, when Mr. Arthur graduated from Cortland College with his Bachelor's Degree, he wanted to become an educator. He [Mr. Arthur] did not have the financial means to pay for the the New York State Teacher Certification Examination, which was required in order for one to be a licensed teacher in New York State. The generosity of teachers greatly impacted Mr. Arthur's life and helped him to realize the important role teachers play in developing the character of students. At the end of the celebration, Mr. Arthur challenged the students to *Dare to be Great* and to always give back to those in need, especially children. The students were encouraged to watch the movie – *Pay It Forward*.

In November, three amazing PHS students in the Drama Club directed three interesting plays in the production, *Triple DeFright*:

- Gordon Evans directed Trifles by Susan Glaspell
- Deanna Rodrick directed The Monkey's Paw by W. W. Jacobs

From observing the students' work, it is clear to see that our children are *creative*, *intelligent*, *brave*, *determined*, *daring*, *collaborative* and *caring*. It's amazing to witness what children can do when they are supported, encouraged and given opportunities. I hope our three young directors remember their Peekskill roots when they achieve fame. It is always important to give back to your community.

On *Saturday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>*, Peekskill High School hosted its first FTC Robotics Competition. There were 13 teams from around the tristate area that competed in this event. It was a fantastic showcase of the creative minds of our children and the wonderful support they receive from their parents. PHS has two robotic teams and one of our teams was allowed to compete in the competition. Many of the schools we competed against have had robotics teams for the past 8 years and have developed funding networks to sustain their robotics program. The PHS Robotics team is in its third year and we were able to beat 4 other teams in the event. Hosting the FTC Robotics Competition has been a longstanding dream of Mr. Carlo Vidrini, PHS Robotics Teacher. fruition. This was truly a team effort. The event was successful and we received many praises for running a well-organized competition.

On *Saturday, November 19<sup>th</sup>*, our extraordinary students in the Selected City Signers participated in a special musical event in Mamaroneck and gave us MUCH to be proud of as members of the Peekskill High School community. As a result of their great talent, they have been invited to participate in other upcoming musical events. Please find time to acknowledge our talented students. It is equally important to recognize how fortunate we are as a school community to have gifted teachers like Mr. Terry Sandler, Mr. Larry DelCasale, Mr. John Hahn, Mrs. Elizabeth Tabone and Mrs. Heather Brown guiding and nurturing our students. On *Thursday, December 15<sup>th</sup>*, our talented students performed in the Winter Concert. Because of the coordination and combined efforts of Mr. George Goess, English Teacher, and Mrs. Angela Byrnes, English Teacher, we had a successful Blood Drive in November. This was our second blood drive for the 2016-17 school year. We had a total of 87 donations, which means that we potentially saved 261 lives.

We give thanks to Mr. Pete Peterson, Security Guard, and Mr. John O'Donnell, Social Studies Teacher, will be retiring at the end of the month after a combined 50 years of service to the City School District of Peekskill. On *December 20<sup>th</sup>*, the School Leadership Team of Peekskill High School made its annual presentation to the Board of Education highlighting steps implemented to improve the school culture, increase teaching and learning and prepare our students to be college and career ready. Moreover, we provided evidence to support our school-wide focus on addressing the five tenets outlined in the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan. This plan drives ALL of our decisions.
